Additionally, Connecticut Public Radio has been the recipient of many esteemed awards, including **two George Foster Peabody Awards, five Ohio State Awards, two Gracie Allen Awards** and **over 60 Associated Press Awards**, including **eight Mark Twain Awards for Overall Station Excellence**.

In 2019, Connecticut Public Radio was honored with a **Regional Edward R. Murrow Award** in the News Documentary/Large Market Television category (Region 10) for the documentary *The Island Next Door: Connecticut and Puerto Rico After Hurricane Maria*.

Reporter Lori Mack won a **National Headliner Award** for her work on “America’s Growing Cop Shortage,” a story she reported as part of Connecticut Public Radio’s national criminal justice reporting initiative.

Connecticut Public Radio also received a **Regional Emmy Award nomination** from the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences (NATAS) Boston/New England Chapter in the Video Essay category for “Sex Abuse at the Hotchkiss School: Woman Shares Her Story,” with Frankie Graziano serving as video journalist, editor, and reporter.

Connecticut Public Radio received **three second-place Public Radio News Directors Incorporated (PRNDI) Division AA Awards**. Reporter David DesRoches’ story *For a Teen with Autism, Being Different Was Seen As Being Dangerous* won in the News Feature category. *The Island Next Door* reporting initiative won in the Continuing Coverage category. *The Colin McEnroe Show* episode “Is President Trump Gaslighting Us?” won in the Call-in Program category.

Connecticut Public Radio also received **one National Edward R. Murrow Award** for Excellence in Video for "A Month After Maria, Efforts to Bring Clean Water to Remote Parts of Puerto Rico."

King's video reporting for *The Island Next Door* was also honored with **two Regional Emmy Award nominations and one win** from the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences (NATAS) Boston/New England Chapter. 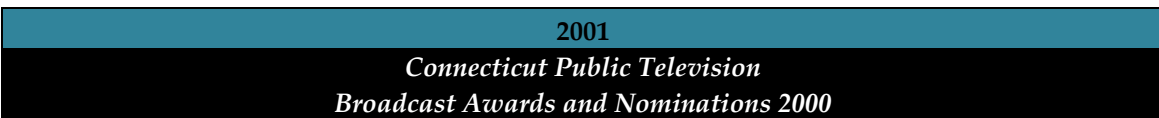
